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HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION CAPS THE END OF ANOTHER SUCCESSFUL SCHOOL YEAR!

On Thursday evening of June 20th, the Class of 2019 turned their tassels and graduated before an auditorium full of faculty, friends, and family. The Class of 2019 received over \$45,000 in local scholarships, not including thousands received in academic scholarship by their respective colleges and universities.

Eighty five percent (85%) of our graduates have been accepted and will attend college in September. Four percent (4%) will join the military, and eleven percent (11%) will enter the workforce. The following represents the list of schools our graduates will be attending: Brookdale Community College, Carnegie Mellon University, Drew University, Fairleigh Dickinson University, Kean University, Middlesex County College, Montclair State University, Rider University, Rowan University, Rutgers University, Stevens Institute of Technology, Stockton University, The Citadel, University of Connecticut, University of North Dakota, and William Paterson University. 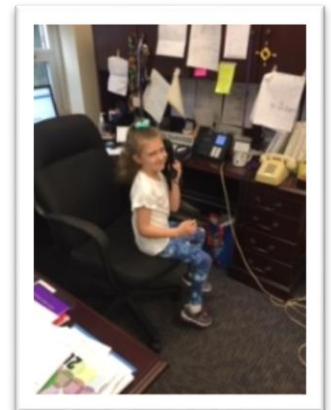
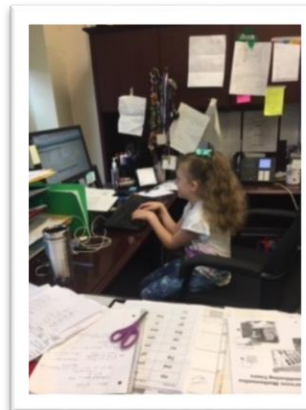
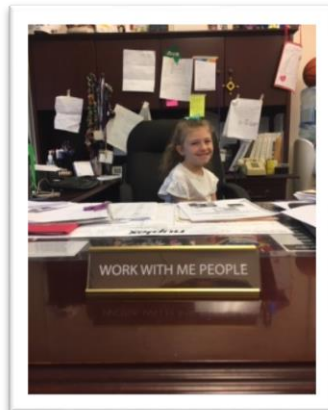
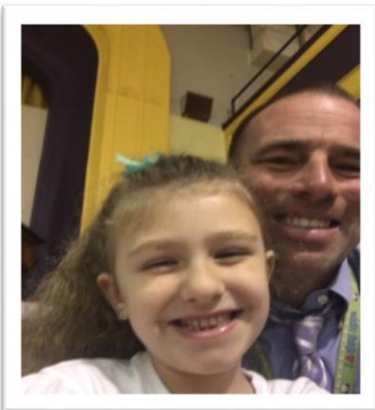
The ES held its Frog Hollow Fun Day on Tuesday, June 11th. A great time was had by all. Thank you to the PTO for supporting this event!

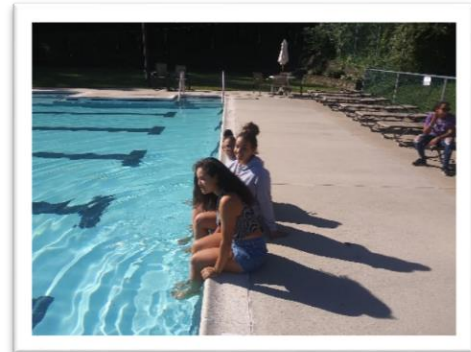
